PEER SUPPORT & PEER PROVIDERS

Peer Specialists/Providers...

- Are individuals with lived experience and success in their own recovery process
- Utilize evidence-based practice to assist and support individuals
- Are trained to support individuals to live, work, learn and fully participate in their health and community
- Supports individuals in developing and maintaining a path to recovery, resiliency, and wellness
- Promotes empowerment and coping skills
- Can support different populations (youth to elderly, marginalized communities, multilingual services, etc.)
- Can provide crisis support, wellness plans, care coordination & follow up care
- Can provide group or individuals services, online or face to face

PEER SUPPORT & PEER PROVIDERS



No Crisis but Behavioral Health Trouble


- Individuals who are untreated
- Long wait times for treatment or medication
- Unhealthy coping (substance misuse, eating disorders, selfharm)
- Potential for unexpected escalation (suicide ideation/attempts)




Crisis

CT PEER SUPPORT SERVICES TASK FORCE

S.B. No 1 - Session Year 2021 An Act Equalizing Comprehensive Access to Mental, Behavioral, and Physical Health Care in Reponse to The Pandemic

Section 18 Peer Support Services Task Force

Establishes a task force to study peer support services and encourage health care providers to use these services

"Peer Support Services" are nonmedical mental health care and substance use services provided by peer support specialists
