HEROIN IN SOUTHWESTERN CT



Heroin

Heroin is an opioid drug made from morphine, which is a natural substance taken from the seed pod of various opium poppy plants.

With 9 in 10 heroin-involved deaths include fentanyl and over 1 in 10 (12%) fentanyl-involved deaths including heroin, most of the heroin consumed in CT contains fentanyl.

Fentanyl

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid. It is up to **50x** stronger than heroin and **100x** stronger than morphine. It is responsible for **63% of all drugrelated ER visits** in CT. Of the deaths involving heroin in CT, **93% also involved fentanyl**.



In 2021, **26** people **died** in SW CT from an overdose only involving heroin, **a decrease of 47%** from the previous year.



In SW CT, **adults 45 to 64** are the most at risk for a heroin overdose.




There has been a **significant decrease** in overdose deaths only involving heroin in CT from 2019-2022.




SW CT experienced a **10%** increase of drug overdose deaths in a year from 136 in 2020 to 150 in 2021.

SW CT YOUTH



Most middle school and high school aged youth reported they feel it is difficult to obtain illicit substances like heroin.



A small group of students who reported having tried illicit substances were 12 years or younger.



Youth who seek substances often do so over social media. They unknowingly obtain counterfeit drugs, often laced with fentanyl.

- Polysubstance use is not always intentional! Many individuals are seeking to obtain a specific drug and do not realize they are using a mix of dangerous substances.



Naloxone is an opioid antagonist used to reverse and block the effects of opioids, including heroin.

The hub **trained 295** individuals to administer Naloxone.

The hub distributed 1,862 Naloxone kits in SW CT.
