

SUICIDE IN SOUTHWESTERN CT





In 2021, the suicide death rate was **5.6 per 10,000** in SW CT, compared to 14.1 nationally, **more than 60% lower**.



has remained steady from 2020-2022, with 53 deaths in 2020, 54 deaths in 2021, and **57 deaths in 2022**.

Suicide Contagion

Exposure to a death by suicide leads to an **increased risk** of suicide attempt or completion for those closely impacted. Suicide impacts not just the individual but the health of their loved ones and their community. We encourage consulting best practices and postvention protocols in the event of a suicide death.



In 2022, there were a total of **388 suicides in CT**, an 8.9% decrease from 2019.



Nationally, suicide is the second leading cause of death among people 10-14 and 25-34 years old.



In 2022, individuals aged **25-44** had the highest frequency of suicide deaths with **21 losses** in SW CT.

RISK FACTORS & POPULATIONS AT RISK

- LGBTQIA+ youth experience increased suicidal ideation and behavior compared to their peers.
- There is a high correlation between problem gambling, mental health, and suicidality.
- Mental illness, including depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, and general depressed mood increase the risk for suicide
